OUR DAY AT KELMSCOTT SHOW



What a disappointment that the WA Breed Show that was to be held at the Kelmscott Show was cancelled this year, but what a great Handler Training Day that the Dexter Cattle Promotion Group of WA quickly organised to replace it. They made sure that there were Dexters at the Kelmscott Show for people to see.

I registered for the day hoping to learn some new skills and I certainly wasn't disappointed. The day dawned a little cool but with brilliant sunshine, it couldn't have been any better for spending the whole day outdoors with plenty of shade to protect from the sun.

The area was beautifully prepared, lots of shade for the cattle and the people, and fenced off to keep other showgoers outside of the Dexter area due to Biosecurity.



The participants varied in their level of experience with handling and showing, from very new to more experienced, and we all learned something new.

We were started right from the beginning, first learning how to tie an animal up, then blowing it out before bathing, how to bath an animal, followed by blow drying for the best finish, and then finishing up with how to clip ready for the ring.

The day was finished in learning how to make a rope halter which all got to take home with us, and answering lots of our questions.



Many thanks to the WA Promotion Group for putting on such a great day, and particularly to Alex and Trish Cabassi along with Russell and Chris Cleghorn for their tutoring. I think that all the participants would agree that we all learnt so much and enjoyed out day.



USING ACCREDITED AI BULL SEMEN

There are 60 bulls accredited with DCAI for public use, and most of those bulls became available in the early years of the Association. Less than half of those bulls had available DNA to be SNP tested, and there has been generous donations of straws from members for others to have a SNP test performed which has been paid for by DCAI.

Many of these bulls no longer have semen available to be purchased, the only existing straws would be carefully stored away in private tanks as they would be precious to the owner of the straws.

Over half of the Accredited AI bulls have not had any progeny registered for more than 10 years, and in some cases it is 20 years or more since they have had calves registered.

DCAI is committed to paying for the SNP (Seeksire) testing of these bulls, however it is not a financially logical decision to seek straws on these bulls and have them tested.

If a member wishes to donate a straw on any of the untested bulls and send the semen off for testing, DCAI will pay for the cost of the Seeksire test.

DCAI has in place a process so that all calves will still be able to be registered by these bulls. The calves will need to be MiP tested and parent verified by MiP through either UC Davis in the US or Infogene (Massey University) in New Zealand.

If you have a calf from an Accredited AI bull that you wish to register, please notify Janelle at LBC which bull you are needing and which laboratory that you will be testing with (either UCD or Infogene). LBC will apply for the MiP report from Neogen and the MiP profile will be lodged with the relevant lab to use.

Your cow will also need an MiP profile to be able to parent verify.

Please allow several weeks for this process to occur as it does take some time to get the report from Neogen. You will be notified once the report is on the Laboratory database and you can then do your DNA application for testing.





PROGENY REGISTRATION PROCESS - WHEN THE SIRE AND/OR DAM HAVE OLD DNA CASE NO.'S


- The Dam and Sire must both have a MiP or SNP profile, please note if using Australian based lab 'Neogen' an SNP profile is required and this step by step instruction sheet is for DNA testing using Neogen.
- DNA case number profile information can be found on your Dexter's online pedigree. If the Dam and/or Sire have an 'old' DNA case number it will look like this on their online pedigree

DNA Case No.: 157711

- If the Sire and/or Dam have an old DNA case number contact DCAI registrar Janelle at LBC, she will look to see if your Dexter(s) have a 16 point DNA profile on file for you. If she doesn't, she will advise you to contact Neogen to obtain a copy at a cost of \$11 per report.
- Once you have a copy of the report, fill out a DNA test request form with Neogen to obtain an SNP profile for the Sire and/or Dam. An updated excel spreadsheet form for Neogen was emailed to members from Janelle at DCAI on , 2022 and when opened looks like this

- Click to allow editing, fill in your Stud and Contact Details in the top left hand side of the form
- Next fill in the Sire and/or Dam's DNA 'Case Number', 'Animal ID' this is their Name, 'Registration' this is their Herdbook no., 'Sex', 'D.O.B.', and the test required (there is a drop down bar under 'Test 1') which is 'Seeksire'. It will look like this



• Next fill in the Sire and Dam info along the same line in the Neogen form.

- Send the completed Application form to Neogen via email (email address can be found on the top right hand side of the excel spreadsheet) with the attached DNA profile report and cc Janelle at LBC.
- If there is enough genetic material in storage at Neogen of the Sire and/or Dam an SNP profile will be created and this will be sent via email to Janelle at LBC and forwarded to you and recorded on the Dexter(s) online pedigree and will look like this


• If there was inadequate genetic material in storage at Neogen for the Seeksire test to be performed you will be notified and fresh hair tail samples will need to be pulled from the Sire and/or Dam placed in hair tail sample bag(s) obtained from Janelle at LBC and sent via Australia Post with the Application form and the soft copy (digit copy) of the form resubmitted via email to Neogen. You will need to fill out on the form the Hair Tail sample bag number(s)

• Neogen will create a SNP profile from the new hair tail sample(s) and this will be emailed to Janelle at LBC, forwarded to you, and recorded on your Dexter(s) online pedigree and will look like this

 Once an SNP number has been obtained for both the Sire and Dam, hair tail samples can be pulled from the progeny to be registered. Fill in another Neogen Application form with the details of the progeny and select the Seeksire + PV test from the drop down bar



- Make sure to record in the form the SNP DNA case number for both the Sire and Dam of the progeny to be parent verified.
- Send the completed Application form (hard copy) with the Hair Tail sample bag via Australia Post to Neogen and soft copy (digital) via email to Neogen and cc Janelle at LBC.
- Once the progeny parent verify for registration and a SNP profile created by Neogen Janelle at LBC will be notified via email and the result will be forwarded to you.
- When you receive this notification you can log into the DCAI official website and fill out an online registration form.
- Once all necessary fees including DNA testing fees, please see current List of Neogen DNA Testing Fee Schedule (found
 in recent DCAI Newsletter dated Autumn 2022), and DCAI Registration Costs have been paid you will be notified by
 Janelle at LBC and the progeny are registered, Hooray!!
